
FRANCES RUHLEN McCONNEL & TIMOTHY STEELE

Lavan Younger Poets Award from the Academy of American Poets, and the Los Angeles PEN Center's Literary Award for Poetry. Born in Burlington, Vermont, in 1948, he moved to Los Angeles in 1977; from 1987 to 2012 he taught in the English Department at Cal State LA.
